House Plant Swap and Giveaway, Wednesday, October 12, 1:00-2:00: Enjoy luscious plants indoors this winter!

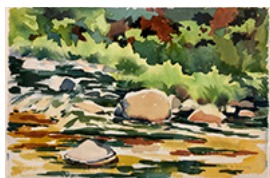
• Bring potted house plants and cuttings to Cook Library by 1:00 to trade or give away.
