Impacts of Weather and Climate on Fall Bird Migration Wednesday, October 16, at 7:00 p.m., presented by the Chocorua Lake Conservancy and Cook Memorial Library. New Hampshire serves as a critical refueling station for birds travelling south in autumn. In this talk, Will Broussard, Education Coordinator for the Mount Washington Observatory, will discuss some of the state's most iconic feathered migrants, how New England's weather helps them move south, and how climate change might impact their journey in the years to come.

One Book One Valley events: Our library will host a book discussion of this year's book, *Becoming Nicole* by Amy Ellis Nutt, on Monday, October 21 at 5:30 p.m. Next, on Wednesday, October 23 at 7:00 p.m., Laura Hodgman will present *No Cinderella Story: Friends Remember Ben Scott "Benderella" Rae*, a talk about the life of one "developmentally disabled" victim of transphobia—a life full with family strife, state institutionalization, hustling, self-advocacy, and friendship. New Hampshire Cemeteries and Graveyards, a New Hampshire Humanities in Action program, takes place on Saturday, October 26 at 12:30 p.m. Meet us at Ordination Rock Cemetery on Cleveland Hill Road, where Glenn Knoblock will talk about the meanings behind the icons and images on old gravestones. Learn the life stories of some of the people buried here. Co-sponsor Tamworth History Center will be holding their annual meeting and potluck on the same day; details to come.
