

**Film: *Living Proof*** On Wednesday, November 7 at 6:30 pm, come watch *Living Proof* by filmmaker Matt Embry. The film combines the filmmaker's personal experience with multiple sclerosis and documentary-style reporting about the current state of living with and curing the disease. Nicole Nordlund will facilitate a discussion following the 97-minute film, and offer her perspective.

**Veterans Day reception,** Sunday, November 11 after the 11:30 a.m. ceremony at the Veterans Monument. We will host a reception and veterans memorabilia exhibit. Join us as the Tamworth community honors our veterans.

**Birds of a Feather:** Wondering what birds in the northeast do for the winter, how they deal with the cold or make their long migrations? Interested to know what birds might visit your feeders this winter and how to tell them apart? On Wednesday, November 14 at 7:00 p.m., join Lynne Flaccus, naturalist and Stewardship Director from the Chocorua Lake Conservancy as we explore the wonderful world of backyard birds, their unique adaptations, what they need to survive, behaviors, and tips on how to tell them apart.



**Project Feeder Watch:** Beginning this month, Cook Memorial Library will take part in Project Feederwatch, a citizen science project that tracks birds that visit feeders. Thanks to our Friends group, the library will have a bird feeder on the lawn in front of the children's room. Throughout the winter, everyone is invited to come see and record what birds are visiting our feeder. Project FeederWatch is operated by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and Bird Studies Canada.

**Getting started (or restarted) with NH Downloadable Books:** On Tuesday, November 27 at 6:30 p.m., Library Director Mary Cronin will give a tour of the NH Downloadable Books site, explain what app you need to download ebooks, digital audiobooks and magazines to your device, and how to find titles that interest you.

**In the Evil Day:** Thanks to a New Hampshire Humanities grant, on Wednesday, November 28 at 7:00 p.m., Richard Adams Carey will present *In the Evil Day: Individual Rights, Town Government, and the Crime that Stunned the Nation*. Carey's book of the same title details the events of August 19, 1997 in Colebrook, New Hampshire, when Carl Drega murdered state troopers Scott Phillips and Les Lord at a traffic stop in a supermarket parking lot and then proceeded to continue his goal of settling old scores. By the end of the day three more were dead, Drega among them, and four people were wounded.

**This month, join our morning book group** as we read and discuss *American Wolf: A True Story of Survival and Obsession in the West* by Nate Blakeslee. Stop in to borrow a copy, and join us on Wednesday, November 28 at 10:30 a.m. for a discussion.
