Westlaw: Thanks to the New Hampshire Law Library, non-attorneys or attorneys who are not working on behalf of a client can get remote access to Westlaw, a premier legal research database, right here in Tamworth. Access is provided on one of our library's public computers (i.e., only at the library).
