Reading Adventurously! For May, we're recommending reading about (and enjoying) flowers, whether it's a how-to gardening guide, a book with a flower on the cover, or something else flower related. It's up to you! Pick up a bookmark with our spring challenges to record your challenge reads for each month.

Large Print works for (almost) everyone: Yes, it's for people who have trouble reading smaller print, but large print also works for readers who have trouble focusing on a page full of text, gives screen-weary eyes a break, and helps kids who struggle with reading. (Yes, we have kids' large print books.) If you love an

edge-of-your-seat read, the New Hampshire State Library has lent us a set of 20 large print thrillers and true crime books. They'll be at our library until the end of June. Come check them out and enjoy reading them!

Artificial Intelligence Explained: A Lecture for Curious Minds, Tuesday, May 13 at 6:30 PM: Retired IT professional and community volunteer Bill Gassman will discuss Al's history, practical uses, and give demonstrations and tips for using tools including ChatGPT and Google Gemini. The presentation will be followed by an optional opportunity for attendees to do some hands-on experimentation using library computers. Attendees may also bring their own portable devices for exploring Al apps, with the Google Gemini app pre-installed.

Up-lifting Grant News: Our library has received two additional grants to go towards replacing the lift that provides accessibility to our lower level community meeting room. The Tamworth Foundation has granted \$5,000, with the goal that these funds will be matched by individual donations and fundraising. The Association for Rural & Small Libraries, through the generosity of the Manton Foundation, has granted \$15,000 for this project. The estimated cost of replacing the lift is \$50,000. Additional grants have already been secured for this project, so our fundraising goal is \$5,000. The lift is working and has passed inspection, but parts are no longer made for repairing this 25-year-old model, and it's time to get it replaced.

June raffle calendar fundraiser is back! The Friends of Cook Memorial Library, along with Carroll County Altrusa, will be selling raffle tickets that give 30 chances to win prizes, one chance for each day of the month of June. Tickets will be for sale at the Tamworth Farmers' Market on May 17, 24, and 31, and also will be for sale at the library beginning mid-May. The Friends voted to give their portion of the proceeds to replacing the lift!
