Art Show: The September/October art exhibit at the Cook Memorial Library will feature the work of Eliza Burke, a lifelong Tamworth resident who took her own life in September of 2023 at the age of 27 after a battle with mental illness. This multimedia show is titled "Hard Conversations are Okay," words included in one of the pieces in the show, and features works of art exploring subjects that brought Eliza joy during her life, and her view of the world as she saw it. An opening reception will be held at the library on Tuesday, September 3, from 5:00 to 7:00 PM. Refreshments will be served.

Grant for Increasing Accessibility: This year, our library received a grant from Libraries Transforming Communities: Accessible Small & Rural Communities, an initiative of the American Library Association to help our library better serve people with disabilities. We are grateful to those who have attended our outreach events and provided feedback so far. At the end of this month we will submit an interim report telling of the feedback we've received from community members with disabilities and our plan of how to use the grant funds to address the needs we learned about.

Outdoor Nature-based Storytime for young children, every Tuesday at 10:30 AM outside behind the library. Be sure to dress for the weather!

Tomato Taste-Off, Saturday, September 14, 9:30-12:30, outside in front of the library: Local farmer Hope Requardt hosts the fourth annual Tomato Taste-Off. Come taste and rate tomatoes in three categories: cherry, slicing, and paste. Home gardeners and farmers are invited to enter tomatoes they've grown for tasting and rating. Drop tomatoes off between 8:00 and 9:00 AM on Saturday morning. For each variety bring one whole tomato for display plus a couple more to be cut-up for sampling, enough for 10 people or so. For cherry/grape tomatoes, bring 1 pint.

Extreme Survival, Friends of Cook Memorial Library program, lunch, and annual meeting, Saturday, September 21, 11:00 AM-1:00 PM at the Tamworth Town House: The Friends will welcome speaker Michael Tougias, author of *Extreme Survival: Lessons from Those Who Have Triumphed Against All Odds*. To determine why disasters happen and how some people survive them, Tougias interviewed over 100 people who survived against all odds, first chronicling their harrowing survival stories, and then discussing in detail the lessons learned. A light lunch and the Friends' annual meeting will follow the presentation. All are welcome!

Did you know? Our library is a member of a statewide consortium that allows Tamworth resident library card holders to access ebooks, audiobooks, and magazines through the Libby app. What users may not know is that publishers of books and audiobooks provide this access via purchased licenses, each limited to 24 checkouts of one title lent to one reader at a time. In order to stay within budget, the consortium recently voted to increase the number of holds that trigger a purchase of an additional license for a particular title. So, if you are finding that your projected wait time is longer, that is why. If reading a print book is an option for you, please contact us or check our catalog. Often a book that has a long wait time in Libby is sitting on our shelf.
