**State Government news:** Governor Sununu signed three emergency orders yesterday:

Emergency Order #3: All providers of electric, gas, water, telephone, cable, VOIP, internet service, and deliverable fuel services will be prohibited from disconnecting or discontinuing service for non-payments for the duration of the State of Emergency.

Emergency Order #4: Landlords will not be allowed to start eviction proceedings for those unable to pay due to their financial situations. To do so would be against the law. All judicial and non-judicial foreclosure actions will also be prohibited during the state of emergency.

Emergency Order #5: Individuals who are unable to work or who have reduced hours due to the COVID-19 pandemic will have immediate access to unemployment benefits. Anyone in the following situations will now be eligible for state unemployment: If your employer temporarily closes due to COVID-19; Individuals that need to self-quarantine or are directed to quarantine at the instruction of a health care provider, employer or government official; Individuals that need to care for a family member that has COVID-19 or is under quarantine; Individuals that need to care for a dependent because of school closures, child care facility closures or other similar types of care programs; Self-employed individuals that are temporarily unable to operate their business because of any of the above listed situations will also be eligible.

**Town Office news:** Any paperwork that needs to be left at the Town Office (Intent to Cut, Driveway Permits, Intent to Excavate Building Notification, etc.) can be left in the black mailbox located on the right hand side of the front door of the Town Offices. This will be checked on a daily basis. Call the Town office at

323-7525 and arrangements can be made to provide you with the forms that you need.

**K.A. Brett School news:** Our teachers and paraeducators are working diligently to prepare materials for each child's continued education. Teachers are using a variety of digital and "analog" materials to meet the varied needs of students of all ages and with consideration to technology access within our communities. Building principals and school staff are communicating directly with families about how to access remote learning materials and resources.

The district is delivering meals to our students at no cost this week. We are still awaiting guidance from the state and federal government about what this service might look like in the coming weeks. We expect to provide an update to families on the status of meal delivery for next week by this Friday.

Our special education faculty and staff have been working on different models in order to continue with special education and related services. Each case manager will be reaching out to parents to create a plan for communication and discuss how the services will be implemented through remote learning.

**Tamworth Community Nurse news:** In response to all of us being hunkered down in our homes due to this pandemic we need to watch out for our friends and neighbors ensuring their well-being. This "sheltering in place" is going to be hard on all of us so I am looking for volunteers to develop a Telephone Tree. Ideally, there would be one Captain for each section of town, like Chocorua, Wonalancet, etc. The first person would call 3 people daily and those 3 people would call 3 more. It could be "by the way, I'm going to the market do you need anything?" or "It's lovely to see my crocuses popping up."

If you are interested in being a Captain in your neighborhood would you give me a call? It's a way we can all be there for one another even if we are home alone.
