Cook Memorial Library news: We have closed our book return. Please keep all of your checked-out items until the library opens again. We are offering pickup service at the library and home delivery. Call us to request these services, 323-8510. We are happy to choose materials for you or your children. Our procedures for both pickup and delivery have been adjusted. We are quarantining what was returned before the book drop was closed for at least three days and staff is no longer bringing items out to you. Pickup times are now 11-1 and 3-5 Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, and 11-1 on Saturday. Deliveries will be scheduled.

K.A. Brett School news: We have started our meal and materials delivery by bus. The buses leave the school at 11:00 am and follow their afternoon route. Deliveries will be made at all bus stops. The driver will honk the horn and will remain for a short time. Please be prompt in coming out.

If your child brings home a Friday food bag, you have automatically been signed up to receive breakfast and lunch on a daily basis to be delivered by bus. For families that preferred to pick up materials and meals at the school, the cafeteria will be open from 11:30 am - 3:00 pm. Please use the rear cafeteria entrance.
