Town of Tamworth news: EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY - TRANSFER STATION GUIDELINES

In order to keep you and our transfer station personnel safe, you are requested to follow the guidelines below at the transfer station.

1. Only transfer station personnel shall be allowed in the buildings, and office.
2. You are asked to practice social distancing when dealing with the staff and others at the transfer station.
3. At this time we request that you hold **ALL RECYCLABLES** home until the threat of COVID-19 has diminished or ceased. If you are unable to do this, recyclables should go in the MSW compactor with your household waste.
4. The construction and the metal dumpsters are still open.
5. The transfer station will remain open Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday 9AM to 5PM to receive your household waste.
