HOW TO ORDER GROCERIES/SUPPLIES

EMAIL ORDERS: Email orders (anytime) to ordersTOS@gmail.com. All email orders must be placed THE DAY BEFORE PICK-UP. Email orders will be packed and ready for pick-up between 11:00 - 12:00pm the next day.

PHONE ORDERS: Call during open hours (see hours above): 323-8872. You may call ahead and place your order OR you may call from your car, curbside. It would be most helpful to receive call-in orders before Noon.

CONTACT-FREE PICK-UP: For proper "physical-distancing", please STAY IN YOUR CAR and wait to be greeted. We will bring your bag of groceries to the curb, with

a \$\$ transaction basket. That is your signal to come out of the car and make payment. Place your check (preferred), credit card or cash in the basket provided. We bring you your change in the basket, all observing our 6-foot distances. You get back in your car with your groceries. Transaction complete!

Orders will be processed on a first come first served basis, to the best of our ability. In the event that we run out of an item that you were hoping for, do not fret! We are doing our best to keep up with demand, and will continue to restock. We will get through this together!

NH Office of the Child Advocate: (From NHPR) “With the increased stress, confinement, and economic uncertainty that has come with COVID-19, child abuse experts are concerned abuse at home may increase and go unreported. Moira O'Neill is the director of New Hampshire's Office of the Child Advocate. She says that with schools closed, many children have lost their safety net, and that we all should be thinking about that.”

“So we have to create a whole new safety net, because if the teachers aren't seeing kids every day, if they're not going to childcare every day, we as a community just have to become a little bit more aware of what's happening in our neighborhoods. So we're calling for everyone, family members, neighbors, the UPS guy, the mailman, the guy that's still working at the grocery store. You are now our new safety net. Keep an eye on kids. Talk to parents. Ask them how they're doing. Ask them how their day is going. Acknowledge the stress that people are probably under because they have their kids at home all day and their routine is disrupted. If you suspect something, if it looks like a child's in distress, if you're hearing a lot of adverse noise coming out of your neighbor's house, give a call to DCYF.”
