The Cook Library offers an array of online materials: NH Downloadable Books for ebooks, digital audiobooks and magazines, Ancestry Library and HeritageQuest for genealogy research, Britannica Encyclopaedia for homework help (or trivia contests!), TumbleBooks streaming books for kids, and Explora to find magazine and journal articles. All you need to access these are an internet connection and a library card.

If you do not have a library card, you may call 323-8510 to request one. A librarian will call you back and register you over the phone and send your card to you in the mail. If you do not have an internet connection, the library has wireless internet that is accessible in front of the building.
