OCC Monday Congregate Meals Curbside starting June 1st: Starting Monday, June 1st the OCC Congregate Meals for Seniors will be available to pick up at the Tamworth Town House and enjoy at home!

If you are over 60, please follow these steps to get your free meal:

- Call Melanie (323-8905) before noon on Friday to reserve your meal for the following Monday.
- Meals will be available for pickup on Mondays from 12-12:30 at the Tamworth Town House parking lot.
- Pull into the lot and tell the person outside your name.
- Your meal will be packaged in a bag - pop your trunk or open your back window, your meal will be placed in your car. Please stay in your car.

The Tamworth Transfer Station will resume recycling of tin/steel, aluminum cans, glass bottles, and corrugated cardboard on June 3rd. To promote social distancing and improve safety, new traffic patterns have been established. (See below.) For full details, please visit the Town of Tamworth Website.

Here are some suggestions for an efficient trip to the transfer station:

- Please sort your recycling before you arrive at the transfer station.
- Flatten your corrugated cardboard before you arrive at the transfer station.
- Since recycling is the first stop as you enter the transfer station, we suggest you load your vehicle accordingly: MSW first, recycling last.

- Please allow a little more time for your trip to the transfer station, as we all learn the new routines!
- If you have large amounts of recyclables that you have been saving, please do not bring them all in at once, as it will overwhelm the capacity of the containers. If you can divide your recycling over a two-week period, it will be very helpful.
- **Please remember to thank our essential workers, Glenn and Rick!**

Tamworth Transfer Station new traffic flow pattern:


Left lane: People who have **recycling materials and MSW (municipal solid waste)** will choose the left lane (to the right of the box containers). We will recycle aluminum beverage cans, clean unwaxed corrugated cardboard, rinsed steel and tin cans, and rinsed glass without lids. Until we have a baler and dry space to store plastics and paper, it is not cost effective or practical to recycle them.

Right lane: People with **just MSW** will choose the right lane (to the right of the box containers,) and then one of the two lanes in front of the compactor in the green building.

Please wait until the person unloading has left before you pull forward to the stop line and unload. Stay in the space provided for your lane when depositing your MSW.

For construction debris, tires, electronics, refrigerators, heavy metal, choose the left lane (recycling lane), and take a sharp left (before the divided lanes to the MSW compactor) and then **check with the attendant before unloading.**

For brush, choose the right lane and pull off to the right beside the chipper to unload. Once unloaded, exit to the right of the green compactor building.
