Grant News: Our library has received a second grant from American Library Association/Libraries Transforming Communities Accessible Small and Rural Communities grant in the amount of \$20,000 to improve access to our lower level meeting room for people with disabilities that affect mobility. As part of the grant, over the summer we will be gathering feedback about using the library from people with disabilities in our community.
