Raising Happy, Healthy, Kind Kids in a Screen-Saturated World, Thursday, August 29 at 7:00 PM in person at the library, a talk by Dr. Michael Rich, author of *The Mediatrician's Guide: A Joyful Approach to Raising Healthy, Smart, Kind Kids in a Screen-Saturated World*. Dr. Rich will discuss the effects of media exposure on a child's health and well-being during various stages of development, and some of the specific health problems related to media use. Rich will also talk about how context is as important as the content of the media kids consume, and will offer actionable strategies and tips organized by children's developmental stages from infancy to young adulthood.

This talk will not be recorded. The library has a copy of Dr. Rich's book to lend, and there will also be copies available for sale after the presentation.
